International Service Projects Update

This is an interesting year for Matching Grant projects. The Rotary Foundation has reduced the monies available by 70%! That's right - there was only 30% of the normal amount of money available for Matching Grants. There was a rush in June and early July to submit Matching Grants. We have just received information that only 7 of the grants submitted by our District have been approved for funding. We are VERY fortunate that we are participating in 4 of the 7 projects.

One of these projects is the StoveTeam project sponsored by the Rotary Club of Irvine Spectrum. Remember when Nancy Hughes was our speaker last year and explained the fuel efficient stoves that could be manufactured in Guatemala? The total project is \$46,230. Our Club is contributing \$1,000 - 3 Rotarians are contributing \$500 each - the District is matching this for \$2,500 more - and the Rotary Foundation an additional \$3,750 - so our Club is contributing \$8,750 or 18.9% of the total!

The second project is for a multi-media classroom in Ciudad Delicias, Chihuahua, Mexico sponsored by the Rotary Club of Orange North. The total project is \$25,250. Our club contribution is \$1,000 and is matched by District funds of \$1,000 and the Rotary Foundation funds of \$1,500 for a total contribution of \$3,500 or 13.9% of the total project.

The third project is with Lautaro, Chile and we are the sponsoring International Club. The Grant provides an emergency vehicle for a rural area of southern Chile. The total cost of the vehicle is \$19,700 and is a 2009 Nissan model Terrano. Our Club is contributing \$1,200, the District \$1,200 and the Rotary Foundation \$1,800 for a total contribution of \$4,200 or 21.3% of the total. The Rotary Club of Lautaro is contributing \$3,000 and their District \$2,000. We are also joined by the Rotary Club of Orange North and Irvine Spectrum with a donation of \$1,000 each.

The fourth project has been one of most exciting for us and also the most difficult and frustrating in our dealings with the Rotary Foundation. The project provides clean drinking water from a reverse osmosis plant of 1500 liters per hour and storage facilities to about 15,000 slum residents in Panchkula, Haryana, India. We found this need by searching on the internet and have corresponded a LOT with the Rotary Club there. The total project cost is \$14,583. Our Club contributed \$1,250, the District \$1,250 and the Rotary Foundation \$1,875 for a total of \$4,375 or 30% of the total project. The balance of the funds are being contributed by the Rotary Club of Panchkula, their District and the Rotary Foundation funds for their contributions. We have made new friends with this Grant and may continue to do projects with them. We have a standing invitation from Sandeep Poddar, the President of their Club, to visit and stay in their home - along with the 17 family members that live there. As he stated - "We are 17 members living in the same house amicably and sharing happiness and sorrows together."

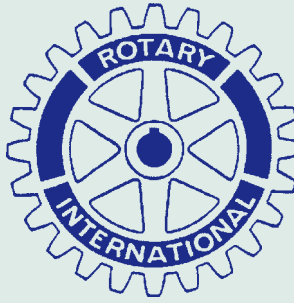
