There have been many highlights during this past Rotary year. The ones that I feel closest to (in no particular order) are:

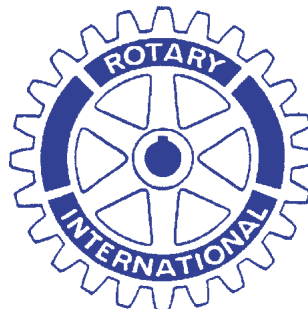
- The very successful car show in October and the hard work put in by all of you.

Rotary in Action!

On Saturday March 25 The Laguna Beach High School (LBHS) Rotary Interact Club traveled to Baja Mexico to take needed food and shelter items to Casa Grande orphanage. Casa Grande is located south of Ensenada about 25 miles. Casa Grande is home to over 50 children between the ages of 4 and 16. Over the years our Rotary Club has been a supporter of this and other orphanages in Baja.

Don and Susie Campbell, local Laguna residents, Chris Krach, retired LBHS teacher, Jeannie Harrell, LBHS scholarship & program director, two interact student parents, and yours' truly, David Duttenhofer, drove fourteen interact students in five vehicles down to Casa Grande.

After arriving we unloaded the food and supplies for the orphanage and arranged 45-50 smaller food bags to be given away in the neighborhood (see picture of students in pickup truck). In a separate truck several students ventured out to find a suitable recipient of a good quality, weatherized, heavy canvas portable shelter. They checked with the local churches and older residents for their ideas. After choosing a recipient, we all spent the next three hours putting it up (see pictures). The shelter immediately became a new home for three families. I don't know who was more grateful that day, the three families or all of us that were lucky enough to have participated.
